Northcoast Regional Land Trust to host June conference in Fortuna

The first Northern Region Conference is scheduled for June 15 and 16 at the River Lodge in Fortuna.

According to a news release from the Northcoast Regional Land Trust, the event will consist of three activities: a conference with a heavy training component, a recognition dinner and a series of activities related to regional organization and conservation priorities.

Approximately 100 land conservation stakeholders, land trust staff and board members; land management professionals; and funding agencies are expected to be on hand for the event.

The purpose of the conference, named “Thinking Like a Region,” is to share skills needed to achieve conservation specific to this region, as well as to share the successes and lessons learned from the work done over the years, according to the news release.

The conference is also being held to develop a cohesive regional voice that can benefit the region’s conservation movement at the state level, and to organize an official Northern California Regional Council of the California Council of Land Trusts to be the voice of the region in the future.

The Northern Region is one of six geographic areas outlined by the California Council of Land Trusts for strategic planning and organizing purposes.
